# CHS Faculty & Students Meeting Their Challenges

As with all public schools, the challenges continue for Catalina High during this time of pandemic.

One of the challenges facing CHS is that the student body is very fluid. For example, 114 new students were enrolled over 90 days and 149 students withdrew. This is hard on the school and its administration, but characteristic of a very transient population. As we go to press, 570 students, representing 34 countries, are Trojans. CHS enrolled new students from Afghanistan at the beginning of the year, and more are coming. The number of Youth

On Their Own (YOTO) students attending CHS has grown to 31, and Catalina Online YOTO students total eight. Forty are in DCS (group homes). The largest class is the freshman, which has many more young men than women.

Despite having 98 teachers and staff, the school has open positions—a Security Monitor and a dedicated Exceptional Ed Teacher. CHS lost a Science Teacher and a Librarian at the end of last semester, along with Psychology Teacher Jonathan Levy. However, there is good news for the band—Antonio Heredia, a new, young and enthusiastic Band Director, started in January. CHS received COVID funds for a Social or Emotional Needs Instructor, but had no applicants. So, the administration closed the job opportunity and used the funds to buy



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computers and printers, replacing the obsolete desktops that teachers and staff currently use. As at other schools, COVID has caused a bit of chaos, hitting both staff and students. Since there are not

enough substitute teachers available, faculty is scrambling to cover classes.

Despite these challenges, the students and faculty are hanging in there and overcoming obstacles. With barely enough students to field complete teams, our Trojan athletes are showing real tenacity and spirit—some exhausting themselves to play entire games without relief.

The AVID program sponsored a fun "Trunk or Treat" family event right before Halloween and invited not only all the Catalina families, but also those of feeder schools, such as Doolen Jr. High and Blenman Elementary to attend! Each of the CHS departments provided information about their subjects and each handed out candy, as did the CHS Foundation. Such

events are a good way to get families interested in attending Catalina.

To promote taking the FASFA financial application, FASFA Fridays have been scheduled, and 64% of the seniors have completed the FASFA application. College Week activities have been scheduled,

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If you ever cheered on a Trojan team at the biggest basketball venue in Tucson, or attended an entertainment event there like Victor Borge, you remember the vast space of the court floor. Well, fastforward to the 21st century, and from Pima Street, you'll see the big, new Mary Hines Gym...and find the old gym is now an open air space surrounded by science classrooms. On that former floor is an amphitheater that was used for

Social; and the area around it for visiting. Ten outstanding graduates were recognized on the presentation floor—as inductees into the Trojan Hall of Fame: Bill Gaylord '57, Sandy Tanner Elers '58, Ray Lindstrom '59, G. Wayne Schumann '59, Thelma Taylor '59, Barry Headricks '65, Thomas L.H. Terry '79, Lynn Marcus '82, Marge C. Gould (Teacher). Grads from many classes were treated to tasty appetizers created and served by students of the Culinary Arts program. Also, Charleen Badman '87, Alum of the Year and James Beard Award recipient, was introduced; and Liz Wheeler Whitaker '60 and Marylyn Schumann Tobey '57 were selected as Volunteers of the Year.

Several classes scheduled their reunions to coincide with this event. The Class of 1970 used their 50th reunion as a time to promote the idea generated by Kathy Peters '70 of donating to the Foundation "in memory" of a classmate. A huge cardboard check was accepted by Co-President, Stephen Gin '83. The amount has grown to \$16,239.25 as shown in the article about the Class of '70 donation. It was a very special evening enjoyed by about 75 alumni and family members. The fall social is a once-a-year opportunity to connect with old friends, meet new alums, and formally recognize individuals who made a difference in their lives and those of others.

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including a door decorating challenge promoting various colleges. So far, 59% of the seniors have completed at least one college application and 51% have been accepted to a college or university.

Also, a new College and Career Center has opened, equipped with 30 iPads and several large screen projectors. This provides a nice venue for visiting college presentations. The Foundation funded a weekly program of Lunch 'N Learn workshops, designed and organized by two college advisor interns from the University of Arizona. They will educate students on the opportunities and

resources available post-graduation. These workshops are aimed at increasing the number of Catalina students pursuing secondary education and/or preparing them for the workforce. They also will teach students stress relief strategies and everyday skills, such as financial literacy and life planning, which are not included in the regular high school curriculum.

In addition, Catalina has two great programs to teach workforce skills. One is the construction skills, which provides CHS students the training equivalent of first-year apprentice programs in carpentry, electrical, masonry, plumbing and sheet metal. The other is Culinary Arts, which provides cooking skills that can be used in restaurants or catering opportunities. Catalina is expanding and upgrading its outdated kitchen areas.

Alumni can get state tax credits for donations to each of these programs as well as others at Catalina up until April 15, 2022. For example, a donation to the culinary arts can provide costs of food for students to learn to prepare various menus. Married couples filing jointly can contribute up to \$400, and individuals can contribute up to \$200. Of course, we also encourage donations to our Catalina High School Foundation, which count as charitable donations on your taxes.

Please notify your classmates that the ONLY authentic Alumni group AFFILIATED with Catalina is the CHS Foundation site (catalinahighschoolfoundation. org) and FaceBook link. People are registering with other FB pages that presume to be connected, and if money is sent it does NOT go to help Catalina but rather the commercial sites.

## **TAX CREDITS**

If you are an Arizona resident paying income tax to the state, you can direct \$200 per person or \$400 per couple to Catalina. Send your check to CHS, 3645 E Pima, Tucson AZ 85716. Put Public school tax credit on the 'for' line. You can direct your tax credit to various areas at CHS (sports, music, general). You will get a receipt.

This receipt will be needed at the time you do next year's taxes when the credit will be applied to your state income tax. Other tax credits may be available.

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# The Foundation Donated \$8,414 in Mini-Grants to Catalina Programs

The return to in-person schooling this fall meant that Catalina faculty, students, and staff had many more needs. The Foundation was happy to provide the following mini-grants:

Lunch 'N Learn Workshops—Jenny Miranda, \$500. These workshops held once a week through May will educate students on the opportunities and resources that are available for post-graduation from high school. They will also provide guidance on such topics as how best to interview, and financial planning,

College Week Activities—Ruth Mann, \$500. to fund an AVID classroom door decorating contest, and college week tail gate activities, including gift cards.

Quizlet Software—Robin Farias, \$191.52 for a year's membership access for five English Language Development Teachers, and the Spanish Department to use Quizlet software to enhance students' vocabulary.

Two Soccer Mini-grants—Tim Bridges, \$425. each to cover the fee for the CHS boys' soccer team and the CHS girls' soccer team to enter the prestigious Brandon Bean Soccer Tournament at Salpointe.

**FASFA Frenzy**—Jenny Miranda, \$500. to fund activities to help students and their families fill out the FASFA application for financial aid.

**AVID T-shirts**—Cody Downing, \$500. to purchase T-shirts with AVID's logo for each of the students in the program, promoting college preparation and attendance.

Catalina Hiking Club—Amanda Shufflebarger, \$500. to form a Hiking Club to expose students to the beauty of the desert environment that surrounds them. Several field trips around Tucson are planned. "Hamilton" musical and U of A Visit—Ruth Mann, \$426. to cover transportation and lunch for Catalina students (30) attending "Hamilton". The "Hamilton" tickets were paid for by the Site Council.

All Staff Holiday Lunch—Lori Encinas, \$650. to contract with a taco truck for a faculty and staff holiday lunch to lift spirits, and promote fellowship.

Girls Basketball Equipment—Al Addleman, \$500. to purchase needed equipment, and pay summer basketball league fees.

**Eegees Gift Cards**—Tim Bridges (via Jenni Bond), \$360. for \$20 gift cards for 18 senior basketball and soccer players.

Health Materials—Dillion Cox, \$300. to buy various health related reading materials, posters, composition journals etc. for the health class.

Art Supplies—Marc Leviton, \$511. to buy various art materials for encaustics and casting (painting in wax).

Cheerleading Pom Poms and Shirts—Casey Richardson, \$500. to purchase pom poms and matching shirts for the cheerleaders.

**Pumpkin Carving**—Wendy McFeely, \$200. for English language learners to become familiar with Halloween customs.

**Snapshot Assessments**—Robin Farias, \$300. This software program gives assessments of English comprehension.

Photographs for Athletic Posters— Tim Bridges, \$325. to pay the photographer who shot photos of each of the seniors in their uniforms. An individualized poster was given to each senior athlete in fall sports. **Teacher Spirit T-shirts**—Kelly Bristow, \$300. to buy inexpensive t-shirts to make into Trojan t-shirts for teachers to wear on Spirit Fridays.

Women's Soccer Equipment— Alfredo Mendoza (AKA Coach IX), \$500. to buy needed women's soccer equipment.
